

## Legislation introduced to overhaul aquatic invasive species rules and regulations

Sen. Tom Casperson (R-Escanaba) has introduced legislation that would enact significant changes to state law with respect to control of aquatic invasive species. SB 444, introduced on June 20, would amend the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act to do the following:

- Create multi-year permits that would be good for three years instead of one with a discount in the permit fee in the 3<sup>rd</sup> year,
- Allow fees to be paid and applications to be submitted electronically,
- Advance the DEQ approval deadline to April 1,
- Specify that the DEQ can begin work on permit applications or amendments to permits while the fee is being processed,
- Ensure DEQ can process permits year-round,
- Allow applicants to resubmit portions of permits to address points of concern if an application is denied rather than requiring resubmission of the entire application,
- Prohibit DEQ from charging another fee for resubmitted applications or amendments,
- Specify that an application is considered to be approved if DEQ misses the
  deadlines in the bill if the proposed treatment area is the same as was
  approved before,
- Require the DEQ to keep track of inland water bodies affected by aquatic nuisance species and list those bodies on the DEQ website.
- Permittees can expand their treatment area without waiting for DEQ approval
  if the treatment is for the same species and utilizes the same approach as
  already approved in the permit simply by requiring notification to DEQ and
  payment of the potential difference between fees.

Additionally, local units of government would now be able to adopt an ordinance to help control, prevent, or eradicate aquatic invasive species as follows:

- Locals would be allowed to charge a fee on the launching or use of a vessel on a waterbody to help with control efforts, administration (no more than 5% of the total fee), and enforcement if the DEQ verifies a waterbody is infested. A fee could not be charged after an invasive species is eradicated,
- The ordinance may exempt non-profits, government entities, or biologists helping with treatment, and
- The ordinance would only be enforceable if 50% of the locals with jurisdiction over the waterbody or 2/3 of the shoreline adopt the same ordinance.

The legislation was referred to the Senate Committee on Natural Resources, Environment, and Great Lakes, chaired by Sen. Casperson. The Senate is in recess for most of the summer, other than individual session days every two weeks, so the bill will not likely receive attention until the legislation returns to full session in the last week of August at the earliest. However, MWA members should take time to familiarize themselves with the details of the bill now, as it may see committee testimony and/or action in the fall, given numerous complaints legislators have received from local lakefront property owners and associations over current DEQ aquatic nuisance species control permit processes.
